

Breaking Barriers Shipment (12 Disciples)

Friends in Action with help from our supporters have built 2 bridges and a medical clinic (called “The Clinic of Mercy” by the local people) in the village of Ojague, Guinea. The missionaries, Ron & Heather Yearwood said “Life is a lot easier now and we feel that doors are being opened to us with these social works of help we have offered the people.”



FIA’s prayers are that this work would demonstrate the Love of God and would soften the hearts of the Muslim people to listen to the missionaries as they explain the Gospel of Jesus Christ. What is truly amazing is that earlier this year the Muslim leaders came to the missionaries saying they were so impressed with what all the Christians from around the world did for us and asking nothing in return that they wanted them to take 12 of their boys to teach them the Christian way.



The missionaries were thrilled with this opportunity of passing on the Gospel to the next generation of Tanda boys for it says in Proverbs 22:6 “Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it.” But with this privilege came the responsibility to feed, and educate the boys. This was a huge step of faith for the Yearwood’s as they had no money to support the boys, but it was an opportunity they could not let pass them by.

FIA were shipping equipment to Guinea and the Yearwood’s asked if we could also send some clothes and soap for the boys. We would like to thank all of you who so generously supported us with this request. Please see below a letter of thanks from Heather Yearwood
